Health Coalition Aotearoa

The Health Coalition Aotearoa launched a petition calling on the Government NOT to cut the free school lunches programme – Ka Ora, Ka Ako – as part of a new campaign.

Associate Education Minister and ACT leader David Seymour is reviewing the free school lunches programme ahead of Budget 2024 in May and has stated he wants to cut the programme by up to 50 per cent.

This would be outrageously mean and a complete tragedy as Ka Ora, Ka Ako is a crucial safety net for students from the growing problems of food poverty and poor nutrition.

In fact, the programme needs to be expanded to reach more children.

The Health Coalition Aotearoa believe a strong response could influence the Government's decision and we've set a goal to reach 100,000 signatures in four weeks.
