Free RATs available until 30 June 2024

RATs will continue to be available to the health and disability care sector and public for free until 30 June 2024.

This is to support effective ongoing management of COVID-19 outbreaks, to enable access to antiviral medications to people at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and to help reduce the impact of the virus on hospital admission rates.
