Ngā Waiora a Tāne

Pae Ora Paiaka Whaiora held karakia early this morning to bring Ngā Waiora a Tāne (MCH Water Park) to life. Situated on the old hospital swimming pool site, the tanks can hold water for hospital use in an emergency for 7 days. It will also be fitted out to connect to community water supply in an emergency.



Roof Shout

MCH held a “roof shout” for the AMHU (Acute Mental Health Build) recently. It was an opportunity for mana whenua to again raise the importance of a culturally appropriate model of care.



The building should be operational mid- 2025 so we’re looking forward to the Pae Ora team playing a pivotal role in this.

Equity Training Package

Together with Te Tihi, Kauri Health and THINK Hauora, Tāhū Ora contributed to the development of the Equity Training package which aims to provide health organisations such as THINK Hauora and General Practices with tools to better meet the hauora aspirations of Whānau.



Te Ikaroa IMPB Hui

On Friday last week, the regional Te Ikaroa IMPB hui was held in Hastings.

The hui was hosted by Tihei Tākitimu and was organised as a day of reflection, inspiring kōrero and whakawhanaungatanga. We were joined by former Te Whatu Ora chair Rob Campbell who spoke about the need for IMPBs to be catalysts for change now that Te Aka Whai Ora is gone and localities are on hold. Linda Tuhiwai-Smith gave a kōrero on the impacts of colonisation on our minds and our hearts and the need to formulate a strong and articulated vision for the future. We also heard from each IMPB in relation to the mahi they are carrying out in their rohe and the impact of changes in the health sector on whānau. The final speaker was Kirikowhai Mikaere, Data and Digital. Brilliant kōrero about data sovereignty and the lens through which we view data. Check out the [Te Whata website](#).



Meso-Level Review – Te Ikaroa 6-13 May 2024

Te Whatu Ora is leading a review of the meso-level organisations in Primary and Community Care [meso in this context refers to the middle layer of the primary and community health care system where Te Whatu Ora as funder sits at the macro level and providers are at the micro level]. In most cases these meso functions are carried out by PHO's. Te Whatu Ora met with healthcare providers, Hauora Māori providers, PHO's, iwi and Iwi Māori Partnership Boards.

13 hui were held in person in Palmerston North, Whanganui, Havelock North, Carterton and Porirua, and a final hui online for those unable to attend in person. Close to 400 people attend these workshops and Te Whatu Ora have tried to capture their views and aspiration. These views will be collated with an aim to get a summary out to all that attended to ensure that their views are included accurately.
