## First results out from the 2023 Census

Te Kāhui Rauranga described the growth in the Māori descent population as a "transformative shift".

- 1 in 5 people in Aotearoa New Zealand are of Māori descent. 12.5% higher than 2018.
- 1 in 3 under 25 year olds identify as Māori
- Aotearoa New Zealand's Māori population is at 978,246 (nearly one million people.
- Growing ethnic diversity. Many Māori have whakapapa that connects them to other nationalities.
